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Scholar to analyze how production and consumption of goods tied a community, an empire, together

The quarterly series continues with University of Delaware's Dr. Zara Anishanslin's latest book

Lancaster, PA (February 21, 2019) – Join us for the second installment of LancasterHistory's new artifact-focused programming series, the Material Culture Forum! On Thursday, March 28, 2019, LancasterHistory Curatorial staff will present in-depth object studies of Lancaster County portraiture and clothing, followed by a presentation by Zara Anishanslin, Ph.D., who will join us in conversation about her book *Portrait of a Woman in Silk: Hidden Histories of the British Atlantic World*.

At 4pm, LancasterHistory Assistant Curator Tori Pyle will present a close look and conversation about the ways in which portraiture and textiles interact, using objects from the LancasterHistory Collections.

At 4:30pm, special guest Dr. Zara Anishanslin will join us in a presentation and discussion of *Portrait of a Woman in Silk*.

Through the story of a portrait of a woman in a silk dress, Zara Anishanslin embarks on a fascinating journey, exploring and refining debates about the cultural history of the eighteenth-century British Atlantic world. While most scholarship on commodities focuses either on labor and

production or on consumption and use, Anishanslin unifies both, examining the worlds of four identifiable people who produced, wore, and represented this object: a London weaver, one of early modern Britain's few women silk designers, a Philadelphia merchant's wife, and a New England painter.

Zara Anishanslin, Ph.D. is assistant professor of history and art history at the University of Delaware.

At 4pm, LancasterHistory's Curatorial staff will offer white glove object studies using highlights from our Collections; at 4:30pm, guest scholars and lecturers will join our group to discuss new research related to our regional history and its material culture, the objects and architecture that surround Lancastrians.
