LANCASTER, PA — The Friends of the Tanger Arboretum, a subsidiary of LancasterHistory, will host an evening program, *Wine & Cheese and a Walk in the Trees*, on Friday, September 5 from 5-7pm at LancasterHistory. The late-summer social will feature refreshing drinks and light bites, plus the option to tour the Tanger Arboretum with other members and learn more about the stately trees and gardens on the grounds. There will also be a "State of the Arboretum" address to provide updates and share recent projects in the Arboretum, and an election of new Board Members for 2025-2026.
