First to Rise & Last To Retire: The Domestic Workers at Wheatland

Saturday, April 2, 2022

Tours from 10am - 3pm at LancasterHistory

Edward Bolger. Mary Smithgall. The Freelands. Rosanna Gordon. These are the few names of the many people employed at Wheatland during Buchanan's lifetime. On April 2, take a special guided tour of Wheatland that places the spotlight on the people who worked to create the comfortable lifestyle that Buchanan and his family enjoyed: the domestic workers. Learn from the history and stories about the domestic workers' lives, their daily jobs on the Wheatland property, and the social division between the workers and Buchanan's family.

First to Rise & Last to Retire: The Domestic Workers at Wheatland, a special guided tour of Wheatland, will be held on Saturday, April 2. Tours will be available on the half hour, beginning at 10am and continuing until the last tour at 3pm.

Please Note: These tours are not our regular General Admission tours and will not be James Buchanan-focused.

Civil War and Civil Rights in Philadelphia

Thursday, April 7, 2022

7pm ET | Online via Zoom

On Thursday, April 7, author, historian, and Villanova University history professor Dr. Judith Giesberg will join LancasterHistory virtually to explore the Philadelphia civil rights community and highlight the work of numerous African American women in schools and churches during the Civil War and afterwards. Giesberg will also look at Lancaster's charitable societies and women's involvement in the local Civil War effort, such as the contributions of Rosina Hubley and Lydia Hamilton Smith.

Judith Giesberg, Ph.D., is editor of the *Journal of the Civil War Era* and a professor of history at Villanova University. She is the author of four books on the Civil War era: *Civil War Sisterhood: The United States Sanitary Commission and Women's Politics in Transition* (2000); "Army at Home": Women and the Civil War on the Northern Home Front (2009); Keystone State in Crisis: Pennsylvania in the Civil War (2013); and Sex and the Civil War: Soldiers, Pornography, and the Making of American Morality (2017). Giesberg also edited Emilie Davis's Civil War: The Diaries of a Free Black Woman in Philadelphia, 1863–1865 (2014) and coedited, with Randall Miller, Women and the American Civil War: North-South Counterpoints (2018). She directs the project "Last Seen: Finding Family after Slavery," which is digitizing "Information Wanted" advertisements placed in newspapers by African Americans looking for family members lost in slavery.
