Discovering A Gentleman's Farm: A History of the Wheatland Grounds

Saturday, August 10 10am at LancasterHistory

James Buchanan is best-known as our nation's 15th President, but he was also a gentleman farmer. From 1848-1868, Buchanan lived at Wheatland, which sat upon 22.5 acres of meadows, orchards, gardens, and more. Join Museum Associate Stephanie Celiberti for a presentation on how the grounds of Wheatland functioned as a farm and green space over the course of Buchanan's life.

The first part of the program will take place in Ryder Hall with a 40-minute presentation. There will also be an opportunity to ask questions. The second part of the program is an optional, outdoor tour of the places on the Wheatland grounds previously discussed in the presentation.

The event, "Discovering A Gentleman's Farm: A History of the Wheatland Grounds," will take place on Saturday, August 10 at 10am at LancasterHistory. Tickets to attend the program are \$5 for Adults (18+), \$3 for Students (11-17 or College ID), and free for LancasterHistory and Friends of the Tanger Arboretum Members. The Buchanan Sisters

Saturday, September 7 Tours 10am - 3pm at LancasterHistory

On this special living history tour of Wheatland, explore how James Buchanan's nieces, Annie, Harriet, and Henrietta Buchanan, forged new life paths that ran counter to the traditional expectations for 19th-century women. During the tour, visitors will "time travel" to 1868 and 1906 to eavesdrop on the Buchanan sisters as they chat about beaus, fashion, and their life goals.

The Buchanan Sisters, a special living history tour of Wheatland, will be held on Saturday, September 7. Tours will be available on the hour, beginning at 10am and continuing until the last tour at 3pm. **Please Note: These tours are not our regular General Admission tours and will not be Buchanan-focused. Living History Tours are an immersive and interactive experience that can incorporate historical tools, activities, and dress to give observers or**

participants a sense of stepping back in time.

Main Exhibition - Thieves & Vagabonds: A History of Law and Justice in Lancaster County

LancasterHistory's newest major exhibition, *Thieves & Vagabonds*, chronicles key moments in the history of law and justice in Lancaster County from the 18th century to the 20th century. From prisons to prohibition, *Thieves & Vagabonds* explores the making, breaking, and remaking of laws over 300 years of Lancaster County's history. Visit LancasterHistory's newest exhibition for a deep dive into crime and punishment as well as reform and repair in the Lancaster community.

Special Exhibition - Dutchirican: A Latinx History of Central Pennsylvania

On Display through September 14, 2024

Dutchirican tells the story of the Latinx community in central Pennsylvania through photographs and artifacts, including a reproduction *casita*, or "little house," like the kind lived in by migrant workers in the 1950s. The exhibit traces the history of a diverse community from the American Revolution to the present and explores the rich contributions Latinx peoples have made to Lancaster County and the surrounding region.

Admission to the exhibit is included with the purchase of a General Admission ticket or Exhibitions-Only ticket. LancasterHistory Members receive complimentary admission.
