A Revolutionary Idea: The Birth of Freedom of Speech in America

Regional History Colloquium Thursday, December 5 4pm Reception & Book Signing | 4:30pm Main Presentation

New York University Journalism Professor Stephen Solomon brings alive a world of colorful and stormy protests of the nation's beginnings that included effigies, pamphlets, songs, sermons, cartoons, letters and liberty trees. Solomon explores through a series of chronological narratives how Americans of the Revolutionary period employed robust speech against the British and against each other. Uninhibited dissent provided a distinctly American meaning to the First Amendment's guarantees of freedom of speech and press at a time when the legal doctrine inherited from England allowed prosecutions of those who criticized government, and connects it the satirists of today like Jon Stewart and Stephen Colbert, pundits like Rush Limbaugh and Keith Olbermann, and protests like flag burning and street demonstrations.

A casual reception and book signing by the author will begin at 4pm on Thursday, December 5 at LancasterHistory, 230 N. President Ave., Lancaster. The main presentation will begin at 4:30pm in Ryder Hall.

Yuletide Family Day is a drop-in event, and is free and open to the public while supplies last.



Lancaster in the '60s


