Beginning June 1, 2019, visitors to LancasterHistory will experience a new orientation film, *Buchanan's America: A Nation Divided.* Created in

partnership with Lancaster-based Aurora Films, *Buchanan's America* uses live-action footage, new research, and scholarly interviews to dynamically portray the story of James Buchanan, 15th President of the United States.

The 22- minute film will become a centerpiece of the visitor experience for everyone touring Wheatland, Buchanan's home. The film allows visitors to develop a more comprehensive view of the politics, tensions, and lifestyles of the time period, and a more intimate understanding of President Buchanan, First Lady Harriet Lane, and others who lived in Wheatland from the 1840s - 60s. 'Not Too Rash, Yet Not Fearful:' 225 Years of Journalism in Lancaster County

A New, Collaborative Exhibition from LNP & LancasterHistory Opening June 19, 2019

LNP and its journalistic predecessors are accustomed to breaking the news about events that make history. In a new collaborative exhibition with LancasterHistory, it's LNP's history that's at the heart of the story. When *The Lancaster Journal* hit the press for the first time in July 1794, George Washington was president, the population of Lancaster County was barely 36,000, and the Whiskey Rebellion was at its height in western Pennsylvania. The nation—and Lancaster County—have changed dramatically over the last 225 years, but one thing has been a constant: the diligent reporting of journalists and newspapers in Lancaster County. In this new exhibition, the journalist's lens turns inward and presents the story of how print media has helped share—and make—history in our community.

'Not Too Rash, Yet Not Fearful' will open Wednesday, June 19, 2019 in Ryder Hall at LancasterHistory and will remain on display until Saturday, September 7, 2019. Admission can be purchased at the door.
