

MUSEUM EXHIBITIONS

Explore three centuries of history through a series of changing exhibitions. Discover the pivotal '60s decades—the 1660s, 1760s, 1860s, and 1960s—through captivating stories and artifacts in our latest exhibition, *Lancaster In The 60s*. Visit frequently to explore regularly changing exhibitions—you'll always find something new to discover.

LancasterHistory engages and educates the public about the people, places, and events that shaped Lancaster County within the context of the history of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the United States of America. We collect, preserve, exhibit, and make accessible materials chronicling Lancaster County's complex and compelling past.

THE DECORATIVE ARTS & HERITAGE CENTER COLLECTION

Since 1886, LancasterHistory has been collecting objects for research and exhibition. Today there are thousands of items that pertain to the history of Lancaster County housed within the Richard C. von Hess Decorative Arts Center, including the collections of the Heritage Center of Lancaster.


