LancasterHistory to Host American University Professor for Discussion on Cooperation, Clashes between James Buchanan and James K. Polk

Dr. Michael David Cohen to Present for LancasterHistory Presidential Lecture on May 18

LANCASTER, Pa. – LancasterHistory is excited to announce an upcoming Presidential Lecture featuring <u>Dr. Michael David Cohen</u>, research professor at American University, on Thursday, May 18, 2023, at 5 p.m.

Dr. Cohen will provide fascinating insights into the relationship between **James Buchanan** and President **James K. Polk** during the latter's presidency (1845-1849). Discover how these two prominent politicians cooperated and clashed on issues such as the Mexican-American War, the potential Buchanan presidency, and the liberation of a Black U.S. citizen from enslavement overseas.

As a historian specializing in nineteenth-century America, Dr. Cohen brings unique expertise to this discussion. He has completed extensive research on presidential correspondence, published two books, and currently serves as editor of the Correspondence of **Zachary Taylor** and **Millard Fillmore**. Most notably, Dr. Cohen served as the Chief Editor of the President James K. Polk

Papers. His knowledge and experience make him the perfect speaker for this engaging and informative event.

Dr. Michael David Cohen is a historian of nineteenth-century America. A research professor at American University, he currently serves as editor of the Correspondence of Zachary Taylor and Millard Fillmore. From 2009 to 2019, he edited the Correspondence of James K. Polk, completing a fourteen-volume print and digital edition of the 11th President's letters. He earned a Ph.D. at Harvard University and has published two books: *Reconstructing the Campus: Higher Education and the American Civil War* (2012) and *James K. Polk and His Time: Essays at the Conclusion of the Polk Project* (2022).
