## LancasterHistory To Host Dr. Louise Stevenson to Illuminate James Buchanan's Lesser-Known Foreign Policy on Human Trafficking

Lecture to Explore the Intricacies of 1850s American Foreign Policy and Humanitarian Efforts in Cuba

**LANCASTER, Pa.** – LancasterHistory is proud to announce an intriguing and enlightening lecture on Thursday, September 28, 2023, featuring **Dr. Louise L. Stevenson**, Professor Emerita of History and American Studies at Franklin & Marshall College. Dr. Stevenson will delve into the complex interplay between the African slave trade, Chinese labor, and American foreign policy during the 1850s under President James Buchanan.

James Buchanan is known for many aspects of his presidency, but his humanitarian advocacy for Cuba remains largely underexplored. His foreign policy initiatives aimed to curtail the human trafficking of African and Chinese peoples into the burgeoning sugar industry in Cuba. However, Buchanan's support for annexing Cuba raises ethical questions due to his apathy towards the institution of slavery flourishing within the United States. Dr. Stevenson's lecture will provide indepth insights into this complex period of American history.

"Buchanan's role in American foreign policy, particularly concerning humanitarian issues, is an under-discussed topic that deserves greater attention. **Louise L. Stevenson, Ph.D.**, has made significant contributions to the field of American cultural and intellectual life in the 19th century. Her most recent publication, *Lincoln in the Atlantic World*, follows an impressive portfolio that includes numerous articles and books. Dr. Stevenson has served as an officer of the Lancaster County League of Women Voters for nearly three decades and was nominated by President Clinton as a trustee to the James Madison Memorial Scholarship Foundation.


