LancasterHistory to Welcome Author David Fisher for Exploration of Presidential Constitutional Duties

Fisher to Examine Varied Perspectives on Presidential Oaths and the Constitution

LANCASTER, Pa. – Every American president takes an oath to "preserve, protect, and defend the Constitution of the United States." Still, the understanding and application of this solemn obligation have varied from one administration to the next.

On November 2 at LancasterHistory's Presidential Lecture Series, author David Fisher will delve into questions such as: How should history evaluate the presidents of this era in the context of constitutional provisions, including its clauses and amendments? Is there a "higher law" than the Constitution, and under what circumstances should it be invoked?

David Fisher, known for his authoritative series "Presidential Chronicles," offers a unique perspective on American history through the lives and actions of the country's leaders. With a Bachelor of Arts in Communication from Stanford University and a Master of Business Administration from Santa Clara University's Leavey School of Business, Fisher brings a wealth of knowledge to the discussion.

Fisher has held various roles throughout his career, including play-by-play announcer, computer

systems analyst, and has worked in high-level government offices such as the Internal Revenue Service, the U.S. Government Accountability Office, and the Department of Defense. Currently serving as a Risk Solutions Lead at Guidehouse, a prominent public sector and commercial market consulting service provider in Washington, D.C., "Presidential Chronicles" marks his debut book series.
