LancasterHistory's Annual 'Yuletide at Wheatland' Tour Program Returns November 23

Tours to Examine Holiday Traditions in the late 1800s at Presidential Home

LANCASTER, Pa. – LancasterHistory invites the public to experience the rich history of the festive season with its annual event, *Yuletide at Wheatland*. From November 23 to December 30, 2024, attendees can observe the holiday traditions of the late 1800s through the eyes of **President James Buchanan's** niece and nephew, **Harriet Lane** and **James Buchanan "Buck"** Henry.

The guided, history-infused holiday tours provide an intimate look at Christmas in the years after Buchanan's death in 1868. Attendees will explore how the holiday spirit blossomed during the Second Industrial Revolution, from the advent of electric tree lights to the elegant decorations of the late Victorian era.

"Each room in Wheatland sets the stage for discussing Christmas in the late Victorian period in America and Lancaster County," said **Stephanie Celiberti**, LancasterHistory Historic Site Administrator. "For example, we'll discuss how exchanging Christmas cards really took off in the late 19th century. The first Christmas cards in the mid-19th century were oftentimes hand-colored and expensive, which made them less affordable to many people. That changed in the late 19th

century. With the rise of mass-production and new printing processes that combined color and metallic inks, cards were more readily available to send to friends and family."

Other topics explored include Christmas meals, sleigh rides, parlor games, gift giving, and Christmas tree decorations.

Dates: November 23 – December 30, 2024

Hours: Monday - Saturday, hourly tours from 10am - 3pm (last tour at 3pm). There are no tours on Sundays, Thanksgiving (11/28), Christmas Eve (12/24), and Christmas Day (12/25). The last day of *Yuletide at Wheatland* is Monday, December 30.


