Harriet Lane's Recollections Living History at Wheatland Saturday, May 4 Tours at 1, 2, & 3pm

It's May 1862, and the Civil War is raging. During this first-person presentation, Harriet Lane, the niece of President James Buchanan and former First Lady, meets with friends at Wheatland and reveals her thoughts on the Civil War, what she has been doing to advocate for American Indian tribes, and how her life must change because of the war.

A panel discussion will follow the film, and will include historians and the filmmaker.

Slavery & The Declaration of Independence Thursday, May 23 4pm Reception 4:30 - 5:30pm Main Presentation

Most Americans know that slavery tore the United States apart and precipitated the Civil War. But few understand how slavery very nearly sank the United States before it even declared its independence, causing many of the founders to confront - and rationalize - their own hypocrisy. University of Maryland Professor Dr. Holly Brewer talks about Thomas Jefferson's thinking, the rebellion within the rebellion over the wording of the Declaration, and the tapdancing the founders found necessary to reach agreement.
